
Field Trip Dumas Golden Beach
















'Bird Watching Adventure: Hooking Children to Experiential Learning!'
The Class III students went on an exciting field trip as a part of their experiential learning program on 'Our Feathered Friends.' The trip was a hook to engage the students and get them excited about the topic. The students were taken for bird observation on Dumas beach. Along the way they were thrilled to spot drongos, mynahs, peacocks and sparrows. As they reached the beach, they were amazed to witness a variety of birds such as painted storks, stilts, heron, Ibis, egrets, sun birds and swift. The students were fascinated by the unique features of each bird and carefully drew and coloured three of their favourite birds. The day was filled with fun and enjoyment as the students gained a deeper appreciation for our feathered friends through this experiential learning trip.



Field Trip The Majestic Baobab









The students of Classes IV A-J went on a field trip to Adajan to behold the majestic baobab tree. The idea was to get the children hooked to the experiential learning project on 'Plants around Us'. The Baobab tree, a native of Africa is a unique plant with a distinctive appearance, featuring a thick trunk and large branches that spread out like roots. Its fruit is high in vitamin C and can be used in a variety of culinary and medicinal applications.

They are often referred to as 'upside-down trees' due to their unusual appearance.

The children observed the tree with great curiosity, recorded their observations and also drew the same. They could list the difference between the other trees and Baobab tree with regard to size of the trunk, leaves, branches and resemblance of the branches to the roots of other trees. Love for preserving nature's gift to the people of Surat and dedicated efforts for the conservation of Baobab tree by the SMC is worth appreciating, thus providing the young learners an opportunity to know about this 702 year old tree - the pride of Surat.



Parampara A Musical Journey Through Beats!















The students of Classes V and VI had a musical morning when the talented Music Department of DPS Surat continued the ongoing series of Parampara- a lecture demonstration series that seeks to instill cultural values and appreciation for music and dance in young minds. In this session they introduced the students to the importance of beats in music.

The meaning and role of beats in different genres of music whether classical, vocal, bhajan, sufi or instrumental renditions were explained with demonstrations. Students were taught to follow the beats by clapping their hands to the beats of the tabla. The difference between the solo artist and the accompanist was also beautifully explained through a Jugalbandi on Sitar and Shehnai with tabla as the accompaniment. The use of various instruments like daak, damru, congo, tumba, pakhawaj and dhol was also explained in a musical way that had the audience clamouring for more. It was a wonderful learning experience for the students!













'The Heritage of the past is the seed that brings forth the harvest of the future.' Keeping this in mind the junior Dipsites set forth to celebrate World Heritage Day through various interesting activities. The students of Class IV B and VI J conducted an assembly on "World Heritage Day" on 18th and 20th April 2023 to promote awareness about the need to preserve our national heritage and how to pass these architectural treasures intact for the generations to come. They also took an Oath to respect our country's heritage, conserve and preserve our precious heritage, and learn its history in order to understand its mystery!

Classes V and VI celebrated it through various activities like tracing the history of numbers from Brahmi numerals to the Hindu Arabic and using Vedic Math to solve sums, the meaning and types of heritage like natural, built and living heritage. The food heritage and importance of food, ways to avoid wastage and tracing the various traditional foods of different states on a map was enlightening for the students. A story and video depicting Durga Puja, which was recently given a Heritage tag by UNESCO, the first Asian festival to be tagged, was also shown to the students. Stories from Ramayana were shown to the students through audio-visual means followed by a quiz on them. The day proved to be immensely interesting for the children!




Academic Detox Days



































Chirps and Cheeps
